

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- I. Rules and Regulations for the Government of Sewerage Utilities, adopted by the Public Service Commission of West Virginia, and now in effect, and all amendments thereto and modifications thereof hereafter made by said Commission.

APPLICABILITY

Applicable in entire territory served.

(C) AVAILABILITY

Available for general domestic, commercial, and industrial sewer service.

(I,C) RATES (customers with metered water supply)

First	300	cubic feet used per month	\$8.82 per 100 cubic feet (Includes \$0.84 for Arrearage)
Next	400	cubic feet used per month	\$8.57 per 100 cubic feet (Includes \$0.82 for Arrearage)
Next	3,300	cubic feet used per month	\$8.53 per 100 cubic feet (Includes \$0.81 for Arrearage)
Next	16,000	cubic feet used per month	\$8.32 per 100 cubic feet (Includes \$0.79 for Arrearage)
Next	20,000	cubic feet used per month	\$8.22 per 100 cubic feet (Includes \$0.79 for Arrearage)
Next	40,000	cubic feet used per month	\$8.08 per 100 cubic feet (Includes \$0.77 for Arrearage)

(I,C) MINIMUM CHARGE

No bill will be rendered for less than \$26.46 per month.
(Includes \$2.52 for Arrearage)

(I,C) FLAT RATE CHARGE (Customers with non-metered water supply)

Equivalent of 600 cubic feet of water usage, \$52.17 per month.
(Includes \$4.98 for Arrearage)

DELAYED PAYMENT PENALTY

The above schedule is net. On all current usage billings not paid in full within twenty (20) days, ten percent (10%) will be added to the net current amount unpaid. This delayed payment penalty is not interest and is only to be collected only once for each bill where it is appropriate.

TAP FEE

The following charge is to be made whenever the utility installs a new tap to serve an applicant:

A tap fee of \$350.00 will be charged to all customers who apply for service outside of a certificate proceeding before the Commission for each new tap to the system.

DISCONNECT/RECONNECT/ADMINISTRATIVE FEES

Whenever water service has been disconnected solely due to non-payment of sewer bill(s), a disconnection fee of \$20.00 shall be charged; or in the event the delinquent sewer bill is collected by the water company, an administrative fee of \$20.00 shall be charged.

Whenever water service, which has been previously disconnected or otherwise withheld for non-payment of a sewer bill in conjunction with a water service termination agreement with West Virginia American Water Company is reconnected, a reconnection fee of \$20.00 shall be charged.

RETURNED CHECK CHARGE

A service charge equal to the actual bank fee assessed to the District or a maximum of \$25.00 will be imposed upon any customer whose check for payment of charges is returned by their bank due to insufficient funds.

(I,C) LEAK ADJUSTMENT

\$5.75 per hundred cubic feet. To be used when the bill reflects unusual consumption which can be attributed to eligible leakage on customer's side of the meter. This rate shall be applied to all such consumption above the customer's historical average usage.

(Includes \$0.60 for Arrearage)

CREDIT TO CUSTOMERS SUPPLYING POWER TO RESIDENTIAL GRINDER PUMPS

\$1.10 credit will be given to those customers supplying power to Simplex residential grinder pump stations provided by the District.

SECURITY DEPOSIT

Not to exceed two-twelfths (2/12) of the average annual usage of the applicant's specific customer class, or fifty dollars, whichever is greater. This fee may be changed by applicable statutory provisions.

SURFACE OR GROUND WATER SURCHARGE

An additional amount shall be charged where surface or ground water is introduced into the sanitary system where evidence of a violation exists.

Surcharge formula to be applied in cases where surface drainage is connected to the District's sanitary sewer system.

APPLICABILITY

Whenever the Utility has discovered that a customer's roof drain, down spout, storm sewer or similar facilities conducting surface water have been connected to the utility's sewer system, and such customer has failed to take appropriate action within thirty (30) days of receipt of a demand by the utility, in accordance with the Rules of the Public Service Commission, to eliminate such connection, a surcharge will be imposed upon the customer calculated on the basis of the following formula:

$$S = A \times R \times 0.0006233 \times C$$

- S = The surcharge in dollars
- A = The area under roof and/or the area of any other water collection surface connected to the sanitary sewer, in square feet.
- R = The measured monthly rainfall, in inches
- 0.0006233 = A conversion factor to change inches of rain x square feet of surface to thousands of gallons of water.
- C = The District's approved rate per thousand gallons of metered water usage.

The Utility shall not impose the surcharge unless and until the customer has been notified by certified mail, return receipt requested, or by hand delivery, that it has been established by smoke testing, dye testing or on-site inspection that rain or surface water is being introduced into the sanitary sewer system at the customer's location, and that the customer has not acted within thirty (30) days from receipt of such notice to divert the water from the sanitary sewer system.

The surcharge shall be calculated and imposed for each month that said condition continues to exist. Failure to pay the surcharge and/or correct the situation shall give rise to the possible termination of water service in accordance with the Rules of the Public Service Commission of West Virginia.
